The YAFS series aims to provide updated information on a broad framework of adolescent sexuality and reproductive health issues, their antecedents, and manifestations


















































# **Emergency contraceptive (EC) pills**

Awareness of EC pills among NCR youth is low.


Only 20% males and 21% females have heard of EC pills.




69% said these pills should be made available but if EC pills were made available, only 44% would consider using or letting their partner use these pills


















## **Summary**

- Low level of contraceptive use among NCR youth
- Methods of choice: Pills and condom
- Most commonly used methods during 1<sup>st</sup> sex: Condom and withdrawal
- EC pills not a viable option but NCR youth are the most receptive to its wider availability and use
- Higher prevalence of FP use: Females, older youth, currently married
- Other possible strategies for pregnancy prevention are most commonly practiced in NCR
















































# Attitudes of NCR youth towards provision of contraceptives to minors
