

The YAFS series aims to provide updated information on a broad framework of adolescent sexuality and reproductive health issues, their antecedents, and manifestations





17% males and 20% females have heard of EC pills.



Main takeaways

- 2 in 3 Filipino youth used some form of protection during their 1st premarital sex
 - Most common methods: Condoms and withdrawal
- FP use among females has declined over time, while FP use among males has increased significantly
- Condom use has the largest increase, particularly among males, while pill use among females has decreased

Main takeaways

- Modern FP method use: Highest in Davao, Lowest in BARMM
- Traditional FP method use: Highest in Northern Mindanao
- Most common reason for not using FP: Concerns about side effects, Desire for a baby
- Low awareness of EC pills and few youth would consider using them
- Other possible strategies for pregnancy prevention (masturbation, oral sex, and anal sex) are most commonly practiced in NCR

Summary

- An increasing percentage of young Filipinos does not have access to any material sources of information on sex.
- Similarly, we also observed an increase in the percentage of youth who have no one to consult with when they have questions about sex
 - Males tend to consult their friends, while females, their mothers
- Discussion of sex at home is still not common.
- Access to modern FP is limited to public health facility, but condoms are usually out-of-pocket expense, as more youth tend to source this from pharmacies
